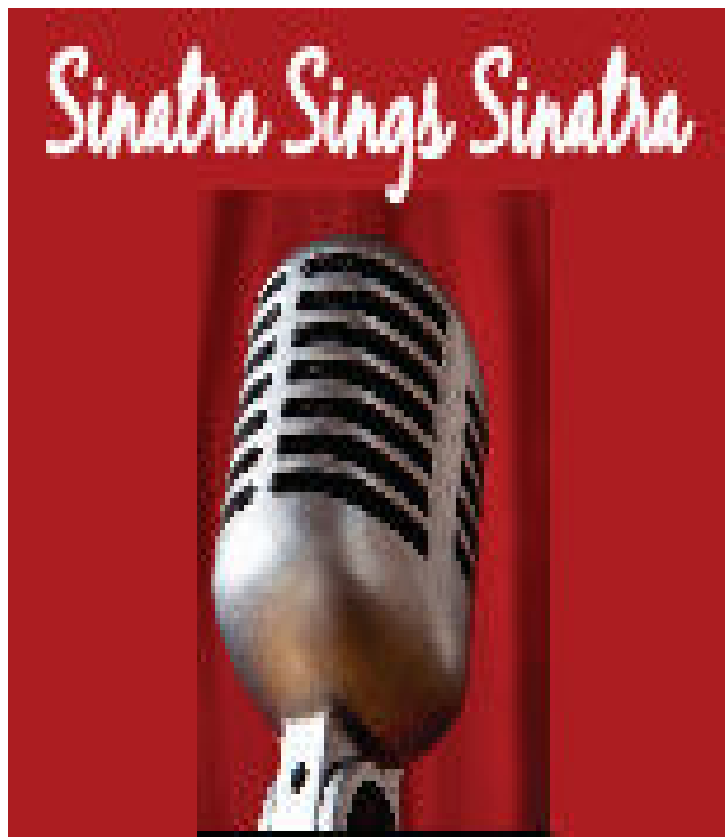

### *The History of St. Ignatius Nursing Home*



St. Ignatius Nursing Home is a long term care facility (176 beds) located in West Philadelphia, PA. Since 1952, it has served the needs of infirmed and impoverished elderly living within the Philadelphia region. St. Ignatius Nursing Home has an historical emphasis of serving low-income seniors and continues that tradition under the sponsorship of the Felician Franciscan Sisters.



Their commitment to ailing elders in our shared community is evidenced by the fact that over 92% of our Residents currently receive Medical Assistance.

St. Ignatius Nursing Home was founded by Monsignor John T. Mitchell, the pastor of St. Ignatius Church. Father Mitchell was a man who cared deeply about his aged and poor parishioners and during visitations found many of them living in deplorable conditions. Determined to remedy this crisis, Father Mitchell found a nearby abandoned house on property acquired by St. Ignatius Parish.

After making essential repairs, he opened the doors of the original St. Ignatius Nursing Home on December 18, 1952. The needs of the community continued to grow and it became imperative that the home expand and modernize. The present facility located at 4401 Haverford Avenue opened in 1971.

In 1986, the Archdiocese of Philadelphia transferred sponsorship of the home to the Sisters of the Congregation of St. Felix (Felician Franciscan Sisters). Today, the Sisters and their dedicated staff at St. Ignatius Nursing Home continue to care for the elderly poor as part of their sacred mission. Their compassionate healthcare ministry is a tribute to the legacy of Blessed Mary Angela Truszkowska, the Foundress of the Felician Franciscan Order.
